SHERATON ROAD SAFETY IS A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY



Our first item on this week's newsletter is a plea to all parents and carers to consider the safety of everyone. This week again there have been several instances where drivers have parked on zig zag lines near school gates. We notice this more on wet mornings when some parents and carers park as near to school as they can. With December looming quick and fast and wet mornings probably becoming 'the norm,' please consider the safety of everyone and park away from school on a morning and a night. We know parked cars are an issue at all schools and that we are not unique with this issue. Please help us to be UNIQUE and to NOT have this problem at Sugar Hill.

Mornings at Sugar Hill are always very busy. <u>Senior Leaders are always at the front of school to</u> ensure all children arrive at school safely.

Parents of Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children will have noticed that all children now enter school through the main entrance door at Entrance C. This new system is working incredibly well. Year One children who are ready at the gate at 8.45am enter school slightly before the Reception children and their parents and carers walk up to the main door. We thank all our Reception parents and carers for your patience and understanding so our Year One children, who are asked to walk up the drive without parents and carers, do not get mixed up with the Reception year group. Using one door also ensures our Year One and Year Two classrooms stay warm on a morning. Mrs Legge and Mrs McCormack are both delighted with how quickly the children have adapted to this new routine. Well done everyone! You are Super Stars!

Parent/carers messages for classroom staff- please use planners to write messages to classroom staff. Planners are checked as soon as the children come into school. This is the best way to ensure messages are shared with teachers and teaching assistants for the children in their classes first thing each day.

We thank you for your support. Systems are in place to ensure a smooth start to everyone's day.

End of school- Collection of children in Year One and Year Two works really well. However, Mrs Legge has noticed that some parents and carers are crossing the yard and not collecting children from the YELLOW SPOTS. It is VITAL children are collected from the spots. Staff can clearly see who is collecting a child. It is also VITAL that children walk out of school at the side of their adult. We have staff deployed at different vantage points to ensure this happens and kindly ask that all parents and carers follow these safety procedures.

The vast majority of parents and carers follow our systems and we warmly thank you for this. It makes all the difference to ensuring children arrive and leave school safely.

Attendance

Attendance continues to be high profile across school. Unfortunately, <u>we still have</u> several children arriving late particularly in Early Years. Despite this being mentioned on previous newsletters we are still having some Early Years children arriving 15-20 minutes late on a morning. <u>Please remember</u> <u>Nursery and Reception children start at 8.45am</u>. <u>All children who arrive after 9am must report to</u> <u>the main office with parents and carers. The Entrance C door will be closed at 9am each morning</u>.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS
